#### Narrative

- With the construction of the new jail facility, the Scott County Sheriff's Office A. employees are experiencing enhanced working conditions in a new facility. The new jail is a direct supervision facility that consists of pods or general population areas in which there is a ratio of up to 64 inmates to one correctional officer in an open area, in which correctional officers directly interact with inmates and are exposed to inmates for their entire shift of 12 hours. Because of this close interaction with inmates who may become combative or aggressive, correctional officers are in need of even more defensive tactic training to ensure the safety and well being of themselves as well as other inmates in the facility. To accomplish this training need, the Sheriff's Office is requesting \$6,247.50 to purchase defensive tactic training mats for this new facility's training room. Instead of sending officers off site for this training, these training pads will enable more officers to receive defensive tactic training on site and allow refresher courses throughout the years to come. These defensive tactic mats will also be used for training to our deputy sheriff's, who also come in direct contact with combative or aggressive individuals.
- B. The objective of this proposal is to enhance the current Scott County Sheriff's Office training facility and to provide correctional officers and deputies with tactics in which they can better protect themselves, inmates in the jail facility and the citizens of Scott County. In the long run, having these training pads on-site will enable more correctional officers and deputies to attend defensive tactic training and refresher courses at a substantially lower cost than sending a few officers and deputies to off-site training.

This request for funding meets the goals and objectives set forth in our values, vision and mission because it is through extensive training and taking care of our employees that we will achieve our mission of providing progressive public safety to all of Scott County's citizens and visitors. Funding for these training mats will enable the Sheriff's Office to train and promote safety habits so our staff can experience a less stressful environment in an already high stress job.

- C. By purchasing these training mats, more correctional officers and deputies will be offered defensive tactic training at a substantially lower cost than it would be to send a few correctional officers and deputies off-site. Reinforcement and remedial training will be offered to ensure the safety of employees as well as citizens and visitors to Scott County.
- D. Training and well-being for our employees filters out to those we serve and protect. With the purchase of this training equipment, all Scott County residents would benefit. All tax paying Scott County citizens would reap the benefits of a better trained staff as well as a cost savings of on-site training, to reach more correctional officers and deputies with less cost.

E. The actual success of the project is on-site training equipment for training exercises. Offering more training at less cost to the County is also a measurable benefit. Though hard to assign a dollar figure to, a more trained correctional officer staff and deputy sheriff staff benefits all citizens of and visitors to Scott County.
