FEEDING OPERATION BY THE IOWA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Scott County Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Section 1. The Scott County Board of Supervisors has received notice from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) that Thomas Dittmer, dba Grandview Farms, Inc has been issued a draft permit for the construction of additional confined animal feeding operation buildings at 12090 240<sup>th</sup> Street in unincorporated Scott County
- Section 2. The Scott County Board of Supervisors reviewed the construction permit application and the manure management plan and determined that both appeared to be in compliance with the requirements of the Master Matrix, Iowa Code Section 459 and Iowa DNR rules and recommended approval of said application on August 19, 2010.
- Section 3. The Scott County Board of Supervisors hereby waives its right to appeal the issuance of the final permit within the fourteen (14) day limit from the time of receipt of notice of the issuance of the draft permit
- Section 4. The Scott County Board of Supervisors encourages the Iowa DNR to issue the Final Permit immediately upon notification of this waiver.

PROCLAIMING SEPTEMBER 27, 2010 AS FAMILY DAY – A DAY TO  
EAT DINNER WITH YOUR CHILDREN

**WHEREAS**, the use of illegal drugs and the abuse of alcohol and nicotine constitute the greatest threats to the well-being of America's children;

**WHEREAS**, 15 years of surveys conducted by The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse (CASA) at Columbia University have consistently found that the more often children and teenagers eat dinner with their families the less likely they are to smoke, drink and use illegal drugs;

**WHEREAS**, frequent family dining is associated with lower rates of teen smoking, drinking, illegal drug use and prescription drug abuse;

**WHEREAS**, the correlation between family dinners and reduced risk for teen substance abuse is well documented;

**WHEREAS**, parents who are engaged in their children's lives through such activities as frequent family dinners are less likely to have children who abuse substances;

**WHEREAS**, family dinners have long constituted a substantial pillar of family life in America;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY** the Scott County Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Section 1. That the Board proclaims the fourth Monday of every September as *Family Day – A Day to Eat Dinner With Your Children<sup>™</sup>*, and urges all citizens to recognize and participate in its observance.
