Resolution for the Local Match of the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard

INTRODUCTION:

The Iowa Homeland Security Emergency Management Division (IHSEMD) has informed Bi-State Regional Commission that a Resolution for Local Match for the Scott County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was not included in the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program application. IHSEMD is now requesting that a Resolution be passed to provide and make available \$14,250.00 in local match for the grant.

BACKGROUND:

Scott County submitted a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) application to complete a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Scott County and its incorporated cities in 2008. Scott County was awarded a total grant amount of \$95,000 in March 2009. FEMA and IHSEMD contributed a total of 85% of the grant or \$80,750. Scott County is required to provide the remaining 15% or \$14,250 in a local match. The local match is comprised of in-kind work provided by Scott County Staff, other participating city staff, and local volunteers; however IHSEMD does require a resolution for the local match to ensure the county will be able to contribute the funds.

RECOMMENDATION/RATIONALE:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors adopts this resolution for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program so Scott County can continue the Hazard Mitigation Planning Process and receive the grant that has been awarded.

RESOLUTION

SCOTT COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

September 30, 2010

APPROVING LOCAL MATCH FOR A STATE OF IOWA HAZARD MITIGATION PLANNING GRANT

BE IT RESOLVED by the Scott County Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Section 1. The Iowa Department of Homeland Security has approved a Planning Grant for the purposes of preparing a Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Scott County.
- Section 2. The funding for this grant comes through the Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Division from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and has been approved in the amount of \$95,000.
- Section 3. The Scott County Board of Supervisors recognizes the fact that this grant is based on a cost share basis with the federal share not exceeding 75%, the state share not exceeding 10% and the local share being a minimum of 15% of the total project cost. The 15% local share can be either cash or in-kind match.
- Section 4. Scott County agrees to provide or make available up to \$14,250 of local in-kind or cash to meet the 15% match requirement of the Hazard Mitigation Planning Grant.
- Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
