#### 4. Narrative

- A. During the blizzard of February, 2011, motorists were stranded with little or no resources on rural roads and interstates throughout Scott County. In trying to rescue 7 civilians, 4 deputies became stranded in their squad cars in deep snow drifts on rural County roads. Due to the weather conditions, some snow clearing equipment that was in use in rural Scott County had to be abandoned. This was a life and death situation and ultimately was rectified by firemen and civilians on snowmobiles. There was no way of getting help to these people in need. During this same time, other deputies and rural fire department personnel were being dispatched to other rescue situations.
- B. The objective is to have a vehicle to reach stranded motorists and those residents needing emergency and medical services in all weather conditions or emergency situations. (We are ultimately called upon to rescue and help.) The blizzard of 2011 made it quite clear that we were not equipped to save and rescue all that needed our assistance, and resources that had been identified to assist (road clearing equipment) proved to be unavailable or ineffective.
- C. The Scott County Sheriff's Office received a military HMMWV surplus vehicle from the Federal Government, free of charge. We are in the process of having this vehicle serviced to get it fully functional and road worthy. This portion of our expenses, parts and labor, is being absorbed by the Scott County Sheriff's Office budget, as well as the purchase of a topper for the vehicle. We have submitted a proposal to the Riverboat Development Authority for the purchase of painting the vehicle and for body work. Currently the vehicle is camouflage and to make it identifiable as a Sheriff's Office vehicle, it will be painted white. This proposal is requesting the purchase of the Mattracks all terrain vehicle conversion tracks for this emergency response vehicle from Scott County Regional Authority. The portion being requested from RDA and SCRA are not budgeted item expenses in the Scott County Sheriff's Office budget. This project will be on-going with maintenance of the all terrain vehicle being absorbed by the Scott County Sheriff's Office annual budget. Please note that the Mattracks are transferrable from one vehicle to another and we anticipate that surplus vehicles will be available for the next twenty (20) years. This vehicle will be made available to all emergency response agencies in the Quad Cities.
- D. The target population is Scott County residents and visitors to Scott County, those people traveling on roads throughout the County and those in their homes requiring emergency and medical services.
- E. Until a major storm hits our area or an emergency occurs where a person requires rescuing in snow, mud, sand or flooded area, we will be unable to evaluate the extent we used this all terrain vehicle, but we must be prepared for any situation. Unfortunately, we found out that during the blizzard in February 2011, we did not have the emergency equipment available to help those that needed rescuing.
