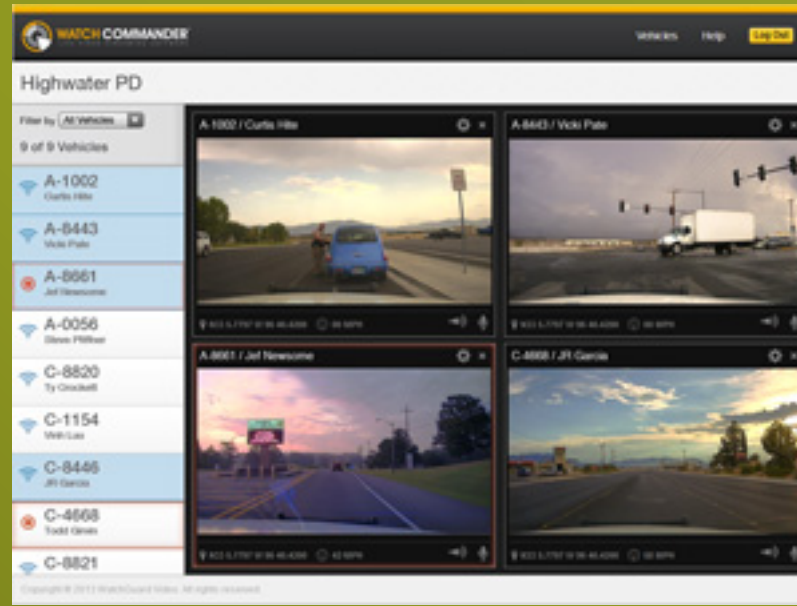

Why WatchGuard – 4RE

- Easy to use by the user / administration
- Up to 3 cameras recording at one time
 - The 4th camera (Body Camera) automatically integrates with the in-car video
- Visibility in a squad car *
 - Camera is mounted behind the rear-view mirror not causing a blind spot
- Costumer Service 24/7 *
- Easy access to categorize, review, save, and burn videos when needed
- Panoramic view *
 - [Video](#) - Panoramic
 - [Video](#) – Standard - This camera can be turned 380 degrees

Why WatchGuard – 4RE

- Rear Camera – infrared / full color
 - Video – back seat
- Pre-Event recording
 - Records in the background in case camera does not get activated by mistake, vehicle accident, etc.
- Fast-upload speeds
 - Less time at patrol headquarters to download the video through a Wi-Fi connection
- Vehicle sensor for activation
 - Speed, Collision, emergency lights
- In-Car Monitor – split screen for viewing *
- Live Video streamed back to the Emergency Management Agency, SECC, or a shift supervisor *
 - Officer Safety – not answering the radio
 - Natural Disaster – live view of the disaster area sent directly to the EMA to assist with disaster recovery

Body Camera - Vista



- Adjustable Lens *
- 9 hours of continuous HD recording
- Ultra-rugged
- After-the-fact recording
- Integrates with the in-car system*
- LED Screen
 - Allows personnel to label an incident *

In-Car Camera's being purchased

- 24 In-Car Camera's (3 systems bought with GTSB funds)
 - 21 - Patrol Vehicles
 - 2 - School Resource Vehicles (used for patrol)
 - 2 - Special Operations Vehicles *
 - Over 323 incidents in 2015
 - 1 - Reserve Vehicle (used for patrol)
 - 1 - Training Sergeant's Vehicle (used for patrol)
- 3 Interview Cameras and DVR's
 - 2 - Criminal Investigation Division (Sheriffs Office Downtown)
 - Current system has failed and unable to pull video when needed
 - 1 - OWI processing interview room (SC Jail) *
 - SCSO - 83 OWI's processed in 2015
 - DPD - 307 OWI's processed in 2015

Body Camera's being purchased

Total of 75 will be deployed

- 41 - Lieutenants, Sergeants, and Deputies
 - Patrol, Criminal Investigations, Civil, School Resources, Special Operations Unit, and Emergency Service Team
- 16 - Bailiffs
 - Court House Security, Administration Security, Transports, Escorting inmates
- 16 - Jail Lieutenants and Sergeants
 - Jail Security, PREA interviews, CERT Operations, Inmate Interactions
- 2 - Reserve Personnel
 - Patrol, Call-Outs, Special Events

Cost to Scott County for In-Car Video's

• 24 WatchGuard In-Car 4RE systems	\$119,880
• 3 units purchased though GTSB funding	
• 3 Interview rooms	\$9,036
• Equipment / Install	\$36,570
• Software Maintenance for 5 years	\$40,450
• Live Streaming Application for 5 years	\$9,250
• Shipping	\$750
• Discount	-\$16,560

Total: \$199,376

- Equipment / Hardware	\$ 3,990
- Software Maintenance - 5 Years	\$20,800

	\$53,864 paid for by Commissary Funds

Deputies and Reserve Personnel:

43 WatchGuard Body Camera Vistas (WiFi)	\$51,385
- Equipment / Maintenance	\$2,025
- Set-up / Tech Services	<u>\$2,500</u>
	\$55,910 paid for by Forfeiture Funds
