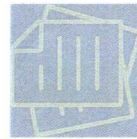

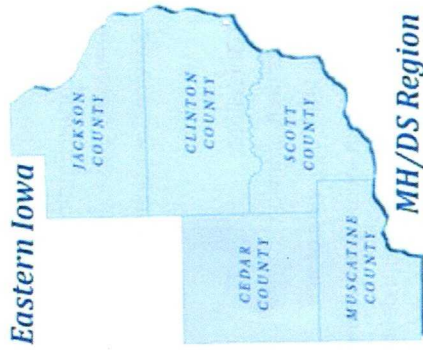

What Help is Available

An "Open Provider Panel" in our Region offers an array of services.

Types of Services offered.

- Outpatient Treatment
- Inpatient treatment
- Medication Management
- Basic Crisis Response
- Supported Community Living
- Supported Employment
- Recovery Services
- Service Coordination

Eligibility Guidelines:

- A resident of Iowa
- Be at least 18 years of age
- Meet certain income guidelines
- Meet certain resource guidelines
- Must apply for other benefits available
- Must have a diagnosis of Mental Health, Intellectual Disability, Developmental Disability and/or Brain Injury

Help with Other Supports

The Coordinator of Disability Services (CDS) at your local County office can direct you to any and all state and local benefits.

How to Apply

The individual must complete and sign an application and a release of information to gather information to make a determination for eligibility of assistance.

Applications for funding can be obtained:

- Access Points
- Mental Health Agencies
- Local County Offices
- Regional Website

You will also need to submit documents to verify information on your application.

Required Documents are:

- Picture ID
- Proof of Social Security Number
- Proof of Address
- Proof of Income
- Guardianship documents or Conservatorship documents

A Notice of Decision will be provided to you.

The **NOD** (Notice of Decision) will inform you of denial/approval of assistance, and the reason for the actions and your right to appeal the decision.

Regional Crisis System

Our Region has a comprehensive plan for Crisis Services. The Region's goal is to increase access, decrease costs and to increase quality of care and the dignity provided to those with mental illness and their families. Crisis services will be organized & delivered by local providers.

Phase 1/ On January 14, 2016 the Regional Governing Board entered into an Agreement, with the Robert Young Center to provide an organized mental health crisis system.

→ Crisis screenings

→ Assessments

→ 24-hour Crisis Line

Phase 2/ On January 30, 2017 the Region entered into a second year agreement with the Robert Young Center.

Phase 2 of our Regional Crisis System will focus on:

- Civil Commitment Mobile Pre Screening- Mobile)
- Mental health Service Connection in Jail
- Co-Occurring Assessment/Treatment-(Mobile)
- CIT Trained Officers-(Training Model)
- Advisory Group by County-(Focus Criminal Justice)
- Prescriber Bridge Appointment-(TeleHealth)
- Trauma Informed Care Competency-(Hospitals/EMS)
- Peer Support Services-Integrated within services
- Transitional Housing-(State Funding Dependent)
