

Mahesh:

After continued discussion with the City of Davenport the request related to the purchase of County owned property at the Courthouse, for placement of traffic signal equipment has been withdrawn.

The City of Davenport is now requesting an easement for the purpose of locating the traffic signal.

With this request there is no compensation from the City of Davenport and Scott County retains ownership of the property that has previously been discussed.

Because of the significant cost for the traffic signal equipment and installation, the City has asked that if or when the County considers future construction in the area that we would attempt to design around the traffic signal and related equipment. We have discussed and I feel the request is reasonable.

We have also agreed that if, the County is unable to avoid this area, due to project needs or additional expense to the project that the County will provide the City with a twelve (12) month notice that the traffic signal will need to be relocated at City expense.

I am recommending that the Board approve this request. Because this involves an easement on County owned property a public hearing is required.

I am proposing that the Board direct me to set a public hearing on this easement request on January 18, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.

I plan to attend the next Committee of the Whole to answer any questions.

Subject: Field Training Officer Supplemental Pay

As you are aware, recruitment as a whole has been a challenge for the County, particularly for the position of Correction Officer. Recognizing the strain on staff due to recruitment difficulties, the Board has approved several resolutions to help address immediate needs. In August 2022, the Board approved temporarily increasing the Field Training Officer supplemental pay from \$2.00/hr to \$5.00/hr for each hour such duties are actually performed for Correction Officers. This measure has played an important role in retaining experienced Field Training Officers in the role.

In June 2023, the Board approved to extend the temporary increase until December 31, 2023. Currently, there are ten (10) open Correction Officer positions and our recruitment and training efforts are ongoing to fill these vacancies. To continue incentivizing current Field Training Officers to remain in the vital trainer role, I am recommending the Board extend the supplemental pay increase until August 31, 2024. This continued support will ensure the training program remains a successful part of the onboarding process for newly hired Correction Officers.

Proclamation for Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness Month

WHEREAS, the United States was founded upon the principle that all people are created with the unalienable right to freedom, and added the 13th Amendment to the Constitution making slavery illegal; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is modern-day slavery, claiming nearly 40 million victims worldwide, and found in the United States most often in the form of sexual exploitation, forced labor, involuntary servitude, and debt bondage; and

WHEREAS, this horrific crime, which denies human dignity and freedom, and fuels organized crime, exists in our nation, our state, and our own community, and

WHEREAS, even though awareness of this crime is growing, human trafficking continues to go unreported due to its isolating nature, the misunderstanding of its definition, and the lack of awareness about its indicators; and

WHEREAS, increased community education on how to identify victims of human trafficking along with increased knowledge of local resources and services for those affected by these criminal actions can help restore freedom and dignity to identified survivors, as well as help diminish the number of future victims; and

WHEREAS, every business, community organization, faith community, family and individual can make a difference by choosing products that are not made by forced labor; by working to protect our young people from sexual exploitation; by addressing the problem of internet sex trafficking and pornography; and by becoming more aware of the problem and possible solutions; and

WHEREAS, Scott County Board of Supervisors joins the Iowa Network Against Human Trafficking and Braking Traffik in their dedication to providing community outreach and education, legislative advocacy, training, promotion of services to survivors of human trafficking and collaboration with law enforcement.

- Section 1. The month of January as Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention and Awareness month and encourage all our citizens to become more informed on this growing problem, to be vigilant and report suspicious activity, and to work towards solutions to end trafficking in all its forms in our community.
