STD Awareness Month

In April, the CDC and the American Sexual Health Association promote awareness of the ongoing effort to reduce rates of sexually transmitted diseases. It is an opportunity to understand what STDs are and how they impact public health, and why it's important to prevent, test for, and treat them. The surge of STDs endangers the health of too many in the United States. In the past 7 years, Syphilis cases nearly doubled, Gonorrhea cases increased by 67 percent, and Chlamydia cases remain at record highs.

SCHD Clinical Services Response

Throughout the pandemic, SCHD has continued to offer STD testing and treatment services to Scott County residents at no/low cost. The theme our team has chosen for 2021 is "Talk, Test, Treat." which encourages individuals and providers to learn the facts about STDs, encourage honest conversation about risks and providing the correct testing and treatment to respond to an individual's risk.
