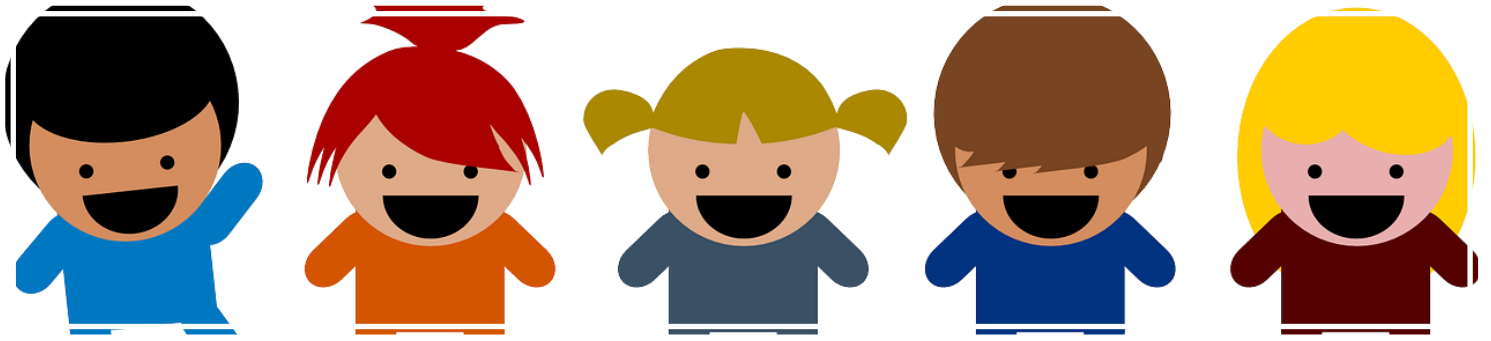

Back to School Immunizations

Back to School

As summer slowly starts to fade, we enter the busy and exciting back to school season. Families are rushing to make sure they have checked all the boxes for school entry requirements. Those requirements may include physicals, dental exams, eye exams, lead testing, and up-to-date immunizations. Families can feel overwhelmed with all the things that they need to accomplish before the first day of school.

Where To Begin

Start with a list of school requirements from your child's school or the school's website. Next, determine what needs to be accomplished from that list and schedule those appointments as soon as possible. Ensure that you have the appropriate and necessary documents to submit to your child's school. Finally, turn those documents in to your child's school so they are ready for their first day of school.

Remember that back-to-school time is the time to get your child up-to-date on their immunizations. We are here to help. We can print copies of your child's immunization record, tell you what immunizations your child is due for, and administer those necessary immunizations if your child is [Vaccine For Children \(VFC\) eligible](#). Immunization clinics are held every Wednesday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm by appointment, with same day access services available throughout the week. In addition, we will have special back-to-school clinics the week before school starts and during the week that school starts. Call us at 563-326-8618 to schedule an appointment today!

World Hepatitis Day (WHD) is recognized annually on July 28th, the birthday of Dr. Baruch Blumberg (1925–2011). Dr. Blumberg discovered the hepatitis B virus in 1967, and two years later he developed the first hepatitis B vaccine. We join organizations around the world to commemorate World Hepatitis Day to raise awareness about viral hepatitis, which impacts more than 354 million people worldwide.
